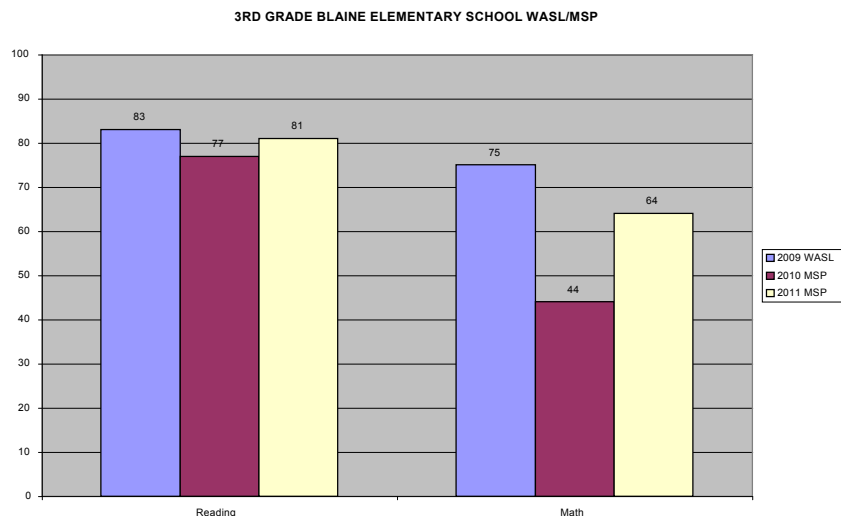

School Improvement Plan

Reading School Goals for Blaine Primary School

Blaine Primary School Staff will design and implement interventions/instructional strategies to decrease the number of Tier II and III students by 5% by January 2012 screening and an additional 5% by May 2012 screening.

K-2 students will be screened using the Dibels tool three times a year. The screener will help identify specific skills needed for students to move to Tier I (standards).

Math Goal for Blaine Primary School

Blaine Primary School Staff will design and implement interventions/instructional strategies to decrease the number of Tier II and III students by 5% by January 2012 screening and an additional 5% by May 2012 screening.

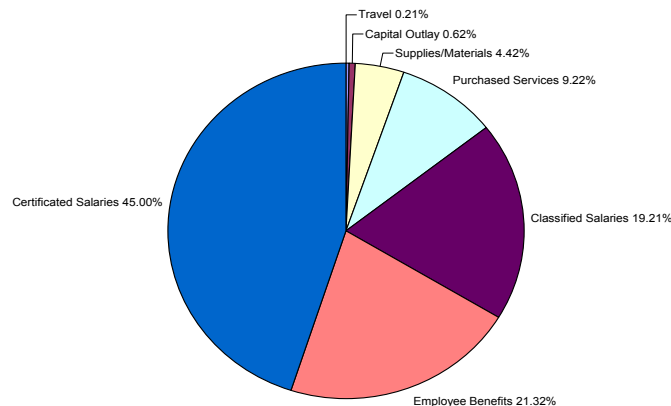
Students in grade 1 and 2 will be screened three times a year using the AIMSweb screening tool in computation to help identify specific skills needed for the students to move from Tier II/III to Tier I (standards). Specific interventions for computation will be developed.

The results are shared with parents throughout the year during parent-teacher conferences. Teachers are also available to meet to discuss academic progress before and after school. It is best to call for an appointment to assure the time you need.

Building Use and Condition

The Blaine Primary School was established September 1994, with Kindergarten through Second Grades. Originally the building consisted of 16 classrooms, a multipurpose area, outdoor covered play area, and a library with a computer lab. As a result of the May 2001 Capital Project Bond passage, the following improvements were made to our building: Additional pod was built with eight classrooms, outside lighting, new phone system, new intercom system, new carpeting, paved parking in the back lot, extension of the covered play area, and playground improvements.
