#### **JOB DESCRIPTION:**

Work as a SUBSTITUTE SCHOOL BUS DRIVER, including but not limited to, the following duties.

- Be able to maintain good conduct of students during trips
- Be responsible for pre-trip inspection and maintaining a clean vehicle and daily bus log
- Be able to work within a changing schedule
- Other duties as assigned
